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

Chinese Fried Rice



2 cups brown rice

1/4 cup oil

1 small onion, chopped

2 cloves garlic, chopped

¼ teaspoon ground ginger

½ cup carrots, chopped

1 zucchini, sliced

½ cup frozen peas

1 egg plus 1 egg white, beaten

1/4 cup low-sodium soy sauce

Cook the rice according to package directions. Set aside. In a large skillet, heat oil. Add the onion, garlic, ginger, carrots, zucchini and peas. Cook until the vegetables are tender, about 5 minutes. Remove the skillet from the heat and put the vegetable mixture into a large bowl. Add the beaten eggs to the skillet, and cook eggs until scrambled. Add eggs to mixed vegetables. Put the cooked rice in the skillet, and stir while reheating. Add the soy sauce to the rice, and add vegetables and egg mixture to the skillet with rice. Stir until heated through. Note: Add cooked chicken to make a one pot meal

- 5. Exhibits to be displayed; Friday 8:00p.m. to 4:00p.m. and Saturday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at the Cadiz Baptist Church Annex.
- 6. Exhibits Can be pick up Saturday, October 12 from 3:00 PM 5:00 PM or Monday, October 14 from 9:00 AM Noon
- 7. Neither the Festival & Fair Board, 4-H Council, nor the facility owner will be responsible for loss or damages.
- 8. All classes judged: Blue-\$4.00; Red-\$3.00; White-\$2.00. Overall Grand Champion \$50.00 Overall Grand reserve Champion \$25.00, Top Exhibitor \$50.00 Judges' decisions are final. Prize money will be distributed by person(s) in charge. Prize money can be picked up on Friday, October 11th after 1:30 PM during exhibit hours.

- 4. Pictures may be cropped (trimmed).
- 5. Absolutely no writing on front of mounting board.
